I compared data from three school years, each 3 years apart: 2015-16, 2018-19, 2021-22. In RPS, this covers one of Bedden's last years in the district, one of Kamras' first years in the district, and the only pandemic year that our division reports reliable data. (This Board Presentation indicates that our virtual year, 2020-21, underreports absences.)

[&]quot;Weighted" numbers reflect how each division WOULD have performed if their economic sub groups were absent at the same rate as the state's average.

^{*}These reports each represent a snapshot in time. Enrollment data is collected in September. Absentee reports are collected at the end of the school year. As you might expect, these records do not perfectly align. This is especially true for our most transient populations (like those VDOE reports identify as "homeless"). These fluctuations do not interfere with this exercise, since general trends remain intact.

^{**}VDOE only reports on whether a student is or is not economically disadvantaged. In the charts below, I label "anyone who isn't identified as economically disadvantaged" as "Advantaged." This is an imperfect label, but it does make charts and graphs a lot easier to read.

^{***}Homelessness is not a direct measure of economic status, but it is correlated. I include it in these discussions to illustrate the impact of extreme economic stress on school attendance.

^{****} In their Chronic Absenteeism reports, the VDOE reports the (Total # of C.A. Students), and the (# of Economically Disadvantaged C.A. Students). They do NOT report the (# of Economically advantaged C.A. Students). The chart below estimates these numbers using simple math: (TOTAL CHRONIC ABSENT)-(DISADVANTAGED CHRONIC ABSENT) = (ADVANTAGED CHRONIC ABSENT)
